

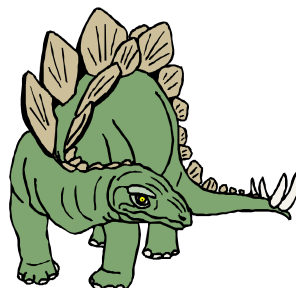
The Library Collection

Nonfiction books are arranged according to the Dewey Decimal System which the students learn to understand and use in book selection.

Dewey Decimal System Organization for nonfiction books

100	Understanding ourselves and others
200	Religion
300	Social Sciences (how people work together)
400	Language
500	Science
600	Technology (how things work)
700	Fine Arts & Recreation (music, art, sports, hobbies)
800	Literature (poetry, jokes, drama)

Organization of Fiction Books

Fiction books are created by the author's imagination and arranged alphabetically by the his or her last name. There are many types of fiction:

Adventure
Fantasy
Historical Fiction
Realistic Fiction
Science Fiction
Sports Fiction



Easy books (also called 'picture' books) use many illustrations to tell the story along with simple words and sentences. Fiction books, popularly called 'chapter books' use more difficult text and few pictures. Easy books and fiction books are located in different areas of the library, but both are shelved alphabetically by the author's last name.
